FEATURED COURT: PIMA COUNTY

Pima County is the second most populated county in Arizona, with a count of over one million people, as of the 2020 census. The county seat is Tucson, where over half of the population lives. It is one of the four original counties in Arizona, and it contains parts of the Tohono O'odham Nation, as well as all of the San Xavier Indian Reservation, and the Pascua Yaqui Indian Reservation. Pima County covers over 9100 square miles and the elevation reaches its peak at the top of Mount Lemmon at 9185 feet. The largest

industries in Pima County are Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, and Educational Services. The county has dozens of parks and trails, and you can find Saguaro National Park and Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument in the area. They are also home to Old Tucson, Pima Air and Space Museum, the Reid Park Zoo, and the Sonoran Desert Museum. The diversity in flora, fauna and geology draws many visitors to explore the area.
